



Mission Internship 2012 Job Description

Position

The Mission Intern program, which is funded by the Mission Committee, will employ between 4 and 6 interns this summer. This program will allow interns to participate in local Christian mission work, to grow spiritually, and to experience and learn about the mission of the church of Jesus Christ.

Compensation

Approximately \$1,740 (\$7.25 per hour) for first-year intern for 240 hours of work

Approximately \$2,000 (\$8.33 per hour) for second-year intern for 240 hours of work

Term

This position will begin on or about June 4, 2012 and continue through August 3, 2012. Each intern will be expected to complete an approximate average of 30 hours per week for the duration of the program.

Reporting

Interns will work in close cooperation and meet with scheduled staff and Mission Committee members each Sunday.

Description of Duties

Interns are expected to:

Regularly attend worship in the Sanctuary at Ladue Chapel on Sundays at either worship service

Participate in weekly intern meetings each Sunday for the duration of the intern program.

Maintain a journal

Commit to growing your own faith through personal devotions and daily journaling

Attend a scheduled training session.

Hosea House – help with tutoring and field trips

Vacation Bible School at Ladue Chapel, July 30-August 3, from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

Food Outreach – help provide food to those in need (June 6 – 17)

Isaiah 58 – provide services for seniors and those in need.

Cornerstone Center – help with early learning

Habitat for Humanity – help with building a new home

Qualifications

At least entering your senior year in high school

Be an active member of Ladue Chapel

Be responsible, reliable, and trustworthy in character

Have an interest and commitment to mission work, in general, and specifically to the mission work of Ladue Chapel

Have reliable transportation

No more than one year prior service as Ladue Chapel Mission Intern

Priority will be given to those who are participating regularly in the life of the church and are, or have been, actively involved in the youth program.

Selection Criteria

Individuals possessing the above qualifications should submit the following to Ladue Chapel by **April 16, 2012**:

Personal Interviews

Candidates selected for interviews will submit themselves to the Ladue Chapel Mission Internship Committee for a 20-minute personal interview, scheduled on **Sunday, April 22**. If another date is necessary, an interview will be scheduled accordingly.
